Sadie holds the honor of being the second oldest female member of our church family. She was born in Yadkin County and as a young woman, her definition of socialization was to spend her weekends at Dobbins Mill Pond with friends. After high school her first job was as a telephone operator. Once her children were older she returned to work as a "Lunchroom Lady" at a local elementary school. It was a job she thoroughly enjoyed. About nine months ago Sadie moved into Trinity Elms in Clemmons. Shortly after her arrival, her two younger sisters, Mary Lee and Jeanette also moved in down the hall from her! They love taking their walkers outside and circling the parking lot on nice days. Her favorite way to pass time is going out onto the porch at Trinity Elms to grab the nearest available rocker.

When Sadie was 26 she married the love of her life, Leroy Weavil, and moved to "Weavil Hill" in Kernersville. When asked how she and Leroy met, she said Leroy was dating her best friend and one thing led to another!

Sadie and Leroy had three children: Gary, Tim and Robin. Leroy and Sadie joined Sedge Garden church and joined the Walker Class, which at the time was made up of the young people of the church! Later, Sadie oversaw the four year old Sunday school class and loved working Vacation Bible Schools. In her later years, Sadie joined the "Lady Bugs" which included Ruth Heath and Frances Miller volunteering in the church office preparing newsletters. I asked Sadie what significant changes she has witnessed in her life time and she said it was that "today's teenagers' freedom to do whatever they want to do." She said she had a good life in her day growing up on a farm and all her friends were also farm kids. Her advice for today's young people is simply "behave yourself!"

It was a delight visiting with Sadie; she thanked me for the visit and for bringing her best friend Ruth Heath along with me. She would love to hear from her fellow friends from Sedge Garden UMC.

Employee Spotlight - Marshal Faircloth

SPRC would like to shine a spotlight on Marshal Faircloth this month.

Marshal is our Sexton and Security. The dictionary defines a Sexton as an employee who takes care of the church property and performs related minor duties (such as ringing the bell for services and digging graves). Luckily, Marshal does not have to dig graves or ring the bell for our services. However, he does watch after the church. Many nights you will find Marshal walking around the church to make sure that the doors are locked, lights are turned off, and windows are secure. He also checks our buses, the Scout pavilion, and the Scout hut.




Marshal was born in Angier, NC. He is the youngest of four; he has one brother and two sisters. Marshal said that even though he is the youngest, he makes sure that his siblings stay out of trouble. Growing up, Marshal lived in Long Island, NY and Hoffman, NC. He graduated from Richmond Senior High School in 1981. After graduating from high school, Marshal moved to Southern Louisiana where he built tugboats for two years. If you have any questions about building a boat, Marshal could answer them! When he moved back to North Carolina he worked in vinyl siding and at Foxfire Country Club. While at Foxfire Country Club, he was a supervisor and then later became the water supervisor for the Village of Foxfire.

While working at Foxfire Country Club, Marshal met several SGUMC members, one of whom was Ray Cates. Ray hired Marshal to work for him in 1997. Marshal worked for Ray for 20 years. During the last eight years, Marshal was Ray's caregiver. Marshal has also been the caregiver for several other church members and has worked at several retirement homes. While working for Ray, Marshal began attending SGUMC. In 2003, he became the Church's Sexton, where he has looked after the security of the property and the members ever since.

Marshal is in the First Fruits Praise Band. He plays the banjo, guitar, and mandolin. When asked what part he sings in the Praise Band, he said that he sings "old fashion." He described that as a mix between tenor and baritone.

When you see Marshal, make sure you thank him for all that he does around the church. SPRC also asks that you pray for our staff daily, as they perform their jobs around the church.




